




Carpet of roses




As for my vision of street photography, I think of the camera as an extension of the eye. The eye doesn't think on its own, but it captures and connects thousands of pieces of information every thousandth of a second. Look around you, and you'll spot everyday scenes whose particularity can be forgotten because they're in the background of your own daily life. They may last only a fraction of a second, and the only difference between them and what you'll see in my work is the 'click' of my camera cutting them off. You can then take the time to understand these scenes, criticize them, appreciate them, and denounce them. We don't just see them, we observe them. They catch our attention, and the camera keeps it.




The Carrousel



The painting captures a moment that cannot be repeated. There is something melancholic, lively, and ephemeral at this moment. I think that makes the painting attractive.


Painting requires investing your whole life - thoughts, emotions, energy. An artist always wants to create a miracle, mainly for himself.








Woman in white. Spring


Through my creations, I capture ephemeral beauty and enduring hope, reflecting life's fleeting nature alongside boundless possibilities.



**DreamWorks** 


The DreamWorks series of photography works were taken during my break from working in the studio. The meaning of the name is that the photography studio is like a space for creating dreams for the audience, and as someone who works in the studio, I and the other workers are like dream creators. At the same time, most workers in the studio, including myself, are passionate about the dream of art. We are gradually realising our dreams by creating dreams for the audience about expression and art. So, this is the dream work for me and the studio workers.

This series of photos captured the dreamy light and shadow in the studio, which were unpredictable but also created a peaceful atmosphere. These elusive lights form illusions, and these shadows form the shadows of dreams.




DreamWorks





My series 'Harmony' consists of paintings inspired traditional Chinese Taoism and Confucianism. Each piece symbolizes the sky, earth, and humans through withered trees, stone lions, and village houses. Using computer software, I added colour blocks to highlight their interconnectedness: yellow for the sky and earth, red for the earth and humans, and blue for humans and the sky. Inspired by Mondrian, I used these colours to reflect the unity found in Chinese beliefs. This fusion of Eastern philosophy with Western visual theory creates a harmonious blend of cultural elements.




During the Pride in London parade at the end of June 2024, I travelled through the parade as a photographer and recorded the reactions of many participating audiences. I deliberately increased the exposure time of the shutter to give the photo a blurry effect. I think the fuzzy slow-door shooting method can better record such a passionate, dynamic moment and increase the photo's freshness. At the same time, I used black and white to discard the disturbance of various colours and highlight the characters' status, strengthening the impact of the photos.






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"Spirit" pendant
